

OTHER TOPICS

BAROCKOKO – SCHLAUN IN MÜNSTER

A tour in the footsteps of the baroque master builder Johann Conrad Schlaun, whose buildings continue to shape the cityscape of Münster until this day. Among his architectural works are the Adelspalais Erbdrostenhof (Erbdrostenhof Palace), the Fürstbischöfliches Schloss (Prince-Bishop Residence) and the Clemenskirche (St. Clemens' Church).



MUSEUMS

MÜNSTER MUSEUM OF PABLO PICASSO ART

In regularly changing exhibitions, this museum displays diverse collections of Picasso's work, as well as works by his contemporaries and friends from the art scene.

DOMKAMMER - (ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL TREASURY)

In the treasury in St. Paul's Cathedral, the sacred art treasures on display date from the Carolingian period up into the 20th century. Over 700 works in diverse genres are displayed on three floors and recount the eventful history of the cathedral's liturgy and art. With its rich collection of goldsmith and textile art from the Romantic, Gothic and Baroque eras, St. Paul's Cathedral Treasury is internationally renowned.

MUSEUM FÜR LACKKUNST – (MUSEUM OF LACOUER ART)

The Museum of Lacquer Art in Münster houses an extensive collection of lacquer art from East Asia, Europe and the Islamic World, featuring objects dating back over two thousand years.

LWL-MUSEUM FÜR NATURKUNDE — (LWL MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY — WESTPHALIAN MUSEUM WITH PLANETARIUM)


Experience culture, astronomy and nature in a relaxed atmosphere – that is possible at the LWL Museum of Natural History, the only German natural history museum with a large planetarium. Take the chance to visit the best planetarium in the world, as here in Münster the planetarium has the sharpest digital resolution worldwide. The museum is located directly on the Aasee lake.

MÜHLENHOF-FREILICHTMUSEUM – (MÜHLENHOF OPEN-AIR MUSEUM)

On 5 hectares of land in Münster's Sentrup area, situated directly near the Aasee lake and the Allwetterzoo (All Weather Zoo), the Mühlenhof Open-Air Museum displays the farming and handicraft culture of the region covering a time period of four centuries. The 30 historical buildings have either been transported from their original locations to the museum in Münster, Westphalia or have been reconstructed according to historical models. In a programme of regularly scheduled events, handicrafts come to life, readings are held in High and Low German, while reading and writing are taught in the country school just as it was done in our grandparents' days.

STADTMUSEUM – (CITY MUSEUM)

The Münster City Museum portrays the history of the city of Münster from its beginnings to the present. Located on the first and second floors above ground, the central part of the museum is the exhibit that provides an overview of the city's history. In numerous special exhibitions, the public is presented with special topics and aspects of Müster's cultural and creative history.

PRINZIPALMARKT, MÜNSTER ARKADEN, STUBENGASSE AND LUDGERISTRASSE

These shopping areas merge almost seamlessly with one another; the Münster Arkaden is accessible directly from Ludgeristraße, the Prinzipalmarkt is located at the end of the street in the direction of the town hall and Stubengasse can be reached from a number of small side alleyways. The shops in the Königspassage as well as Münster's very well-known ice cream parlour "Firenze" can both be found in Hötteweg, a side alleyway off Ludgeristraße.

Thus, Ludgeristraße is definitely a good place to start when heading out on a shopping spree through the city.
